The Breast, Cervical and Colon Health Program provides free cancer screening for eligible WA residents.

This program serves people who:

- Don't have health insurance or have a high deductible.
- Have low income.
- Meet the age guidelines.

Services include:

- Breast cancer screenings (breast exams and mammograms).
- Cervical cancer screenings (Pap and HPV tests).
- Follow-up tests as needed, based on screening results.
- Assistance with navigating resources for treatment if needed.

- As you get older, you are at higher risk of getting cancer.
- If cancer is found early, it is often easier to treat and treatment is more successful.
- The best way to find cancer early is through **routine screening**. There are often no warning signs.

you may still be eligible for free cancer
screenings.
